Instructions



Performing the Chear Consonant Confusion Test (CCT) and Auditory Performance Test (APT)

These tests were developed by Dr Josephine Marriage in 2003. They were adapted from the Reed Test devised by Michael Reed BSc and is illustrated by Stephen Lliffe. Both the CCT and APT consist of 10 sets of 4 monosyllabic words printed onto a single page. Each set of four images has six spoken presentations, so that two of the four words are repeated in a single test procedure.

To perform either test, first decide on the presentation levels appropriate and whether to test with speech in noise or in quiet. Ask the child to point to a picture after hearing a word and record the responses. After six presentations, turn the card to the next page. Add up the total words correct out of a possible total of 60.

For children aged 4 and above – all the pages assess consonant discrimination.
